Dear colleagues! Before you is the first (test) edition of the reference book, which contains statistical and other information about crimes and incidents of criminal and terrorist nature committed in educational as well as other children's institutions. The handbook mainly contains information on quantitative data, some criminological features of the crimes mentioned in it, as well as the results of statistical analysis of time periods in comparison.

The main method of data collection is the analysis of open sources, mainly publications in the media, criminological literature, as well as specialized resources on the Internet. At the moment I managed to collect and systematize data for 23 years, from 2000 to 2023 inclusive. Taking into account the method of data collection, I admit that when processing the information, I may have missed something or indicated incorrect data, as a result, the lists may not include all incidents and not take into account all the features of the committed crimes. At present, and to the extent possible in the future, work on collecting new and correcting existing information will continue. New editions of the handbook will be published periodically, revised and updated to reflect the information that is coming in.

I will be very grateful to everyone who is ready to help me in this work, to supplement the handbook with information on crimes that are not listed in it. In addition, if anyone has looked more closely at the crimes listed and knows circumstances and important details that may be helpful, I would also be very grateful if you could share this information. Principles for collecting, reviewing, referring and verifying information, as well as contact information for contacting the author and editor-in-chief of the guide.

My goal: to make a useful, convenient, informative, and, most importantly, publicly available, reference and analytical tool, for researchers and specialists in the security of schools and other educational institutions, as well as for all those interested in this topic.

#### **Principles of locating, sorting and analyzing information.**

All collected information is divided into two separate blocks:

##### Block 1 - General Statistics:

Data on the total number of incidents in kindergartens, schools, colleges, universities and other educational institutions, as well as places where children are present en masse. The reporting includes serious and especially serious crimes against persons, crimes committed with weapons (various objects, devices, substances used as weapons) and terrorist acts committed in these institutions. Regardless of the motives and goals of the perpetrators.

##### Block 2 - Crimes with signs of mass murder or terrorist acts:

This overview includes those incidents (from block #1) that have the characteristics (in terms of objectives, motives or actual circumstances) of a mass murder or terrorist act.

##### The information from both blocks is sorted:

1. by method of commission;
2. by the weapon used (various objects, devices, substances used as weapons);
3. by the nature of the attack (single or group);
4. by type of attack (external or internal);
5. by the number of victims (total, dead, wounded);

6. by gender of the perpetrator;
7. by age of the offender;
8. by the relation of the perpetrator to the object of attack;
9. by object of attack (type: kindergarten, school, college, university).

In the first block, only figures are used, while in the second block, each case is briefly described and some details of the crime are detailed (for ethical and professional reasons, the data are anonymized). In addition to the above 9 items, it contains information such as:

10. location of the attack (country, city);
11. outcome for the perpetrator (suicide, elimination by police, voluntary surrender, forceful apprehension, injury and arrest);
12. presence of a statement or manifesto by the perpetrator (its form and nature);
13. proportion of external and internal attacks;
14. important features (if any).

### **Analytics:**

#### Summary Analysis:

Contains summarized information for a five-year period, with percentages of a parameter based on the results of the reporting period;

#### Comparative analysis:

Contains summarized information for two five-year periods, with determination of the percentages of a parameter at the end of the reporting period and comparison of their values with the values of the previous similar period. For example: values of the period 2005-2009 - relative to the values of the period 2000 - 2004;

#### Dynamic analysis:

Contains summarized information for three or more five-year periods, determining the percentages of a parameter at the end of the reporting period and comparing their values to the values of the preceding and subsequent similar period. For example: values of the period 2005 - 2009 - relative to values of the period 2000 - 2004, 2010 - 2014, 2015 - 2019;

#### Statistical model of a probable suspect:

A brief composite image, of a conditional offender, developed from statistical data from one or more periods. Contains information such as: gender, age, weapon used, relationship to the institution, nature of attack, other characteristics. The model is supplemented with each new period.

### **Features of data calculation:**

Information is taken from open sources, mainly from media publications. These publications do not always contain accurate information about the identity of the perpetrator, this is due to the peculiarities of legislation and information policy in some countries.

What information is accepted for reporting and to what extent:

1. complete information - when the source contains data on suspects: number, gender, age, status;
2. partial information - when the source does not contain all the data about the suspects: for example, it is stated "one suspected student of this school was detained on suspicion of involvement", in this case only the number and status are accurate, they are indicated in the report on the number and status of subjects, while gender, age are indicated as unknown;
3. lack of information - when the source contains only a description of the crime, but no information about the suspects, because the crime or terrorist act remained unsolved, in this case no information about the subjects is indicated in the report.

**Important:** When evaluating statistical data, it should be taken into account that their reliability corresponds to the real situation only by 60 - 65%. The reasons for such deviations are as follows:

1. not all countries publish data on such cases in the public domain, or they do, but in a distorted (most often underreported) form;
2. in cases where a crime can be prevented at the preparation stage, it is not always possible to prove the suspect's direct intent to commit a mass murder or terrorist act. Therefore, many criminals escape responsibility for their actual intent, receiving formal punishment for offenses of minor gravity, such as illegal possession of weapons, insults, threats, possession and distribution of extremist materials;
3. in cases when the crime can be prevented in the initial stage, before the occurrence of particularly severe consequences (e.g., the perpetrator inflicted only light wounds on 1 or 2 people, the weapon for some reason did not go off, the guards or others managed to disarm and detain, etc.), it is also not always possible to prove the direct intent of the suspect to commit a mass murder or terrorist act. On the advice of defense lawyers, suspects testify that they did not plan to kill anyone, but only wanted to scare, or that it was a prank.

male (93.6% of cases), aged between 18 and 30 years (36.8% of cases) or under 18 years (35.2% of cases), armed with a firearm (55.9% of cases), acting alone (91.4% of cases), not a student or employee of the institution he is attacking (54.3% of cases), having personal, ulterior motives for the attack, not having made public statements of intent and purpose (88.5% of cases), will surrender alive when the police appear (69.5% of cases) and will not resist (92.2% of cases), the main goal of the perpetrator is to destroy as many victims as possible (91.7% of cases) rather than to make demands and negotiate, the likely target of the attack is a high school (55.1% of cases).

**Calculation methodology:**

The analysis is based on statistics for a certain period, crimes falling under the characteristics of mass murder and terrorist acts are taken into account (section 2. of the summary analysis).

Gender, age, weapon use, subject status and likely target of attack are calculated based on the highest statistical indicators.

The indicator «Acts alone» is calculated from the ratio of the number of crimes committed alone to those committed as part of a group.

The indicator «Has personal, ulterior motives for the attack, has not made public statements about intentions and goals» is calculated from the ratio of the number of crimes where there is information about the manifesto (other forms of public statements) of the perpetrator and crimes where there is no such information.

The indicator «Will surrender alive when police appear» is calculated from the ratio of crimes in which the suspect was apprehended alive at the scene of the crime or elsewhere to crimes where the suspect committed suicide (including attempts) or was eliminated by the police.

The indicator «Will not resist» is calculated from the ratio of crimes in which the suspect was apprehended alive at the crime scene or other location to crimes where the suspect resisted and was eliminated by the police.

The indicator «The main goal of the perpetrator is to eliminate as many victims as possible» is calculated from the ratio of the proportion of crimes involving hostage-taking.
